CDSME TRAINING ACADEMY

BY THE NUMBERS...

- 5 Master Trainings over 2 years:
 - 3 CDSMP In-Person 5-day Trainings (Asheville, Charlotte, Greenville)
 - 2 Master Training Online Cross-Trainings (DSMP, CPSMP)
 - 43 in-state participants
 - 15 out-of-state participants
- 2 additional training sessions the last afternoon:
 - Disabilities Inclusion
 - Health Equity and Health Disparities

- Approximate cost of \$15,000 per in-person Master Training
 - 6 T-trainers available in-state
 - \$225 cost for in-state participant
 - \$800 cost for out-of-state participant
 - *scholarships available
- Participation by AAAs, Councils on Aging, Senior Centers, Veterans Services, LME/MCOs, Retirement Communities, Health Centers, Universities, State Agencies, American Indian Tribes...

The mission of the Asheville Buncombe Institute of Parity Achievement (ABIPA) is to promote economic, social, and health parity achievement for African Americans and other underserved populations in Buncombe County through advocacy, education, research, and community partnerships.

MIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM



The Migrant Education Program (MEP) is a federally funded program that assists migratory farm worker students in achieving academic success. It assists children and youth ages 3-21 whose families have moved to Buncombe County within the last three years in search of work in agriculture. Eligible students are offered: home visits, interpreters, parent meetings, academic help, school supplies, help finding health resources, free books and materials for English language learning, and assistance in transferring records to new schools.



- To effectively serve hard-to-reach populations, look beyond traditional partners
- Public schools are trusted institutions for many Latino families
- It is important to evaluate limitations and seek outside support to overcome barriers in program implementation
